ACHS Students Ranked Nationally in "Le Grand Concours"

Congratulations to several ACHS students who have ranked nationally in the 82nd annual National French Contest, "Le Grand Concours"! "Le Grand Concours" is a national competition sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of French. Spanish Honor

ACHS Students Attain National Recognition on National Spanish Exam

Congratulations to the Spanish students from ACHS who attained national recognition for excellent performance on the 2017 National Spanish Examinations! "Attaining a medal or honorable mention for any student on the National Spanish Examinations is very prestigious," said Kevin Cessna-Buscemi, National Director of the Exams, "because the exams are the largest of their kind in the United States with over 157,000 students participating in 2017."
